A GREAT CHANGE.

PULLMAN, ILL. MADE COMMONPLACE BY DECREE OF COURT.

ts a Model I wait Dies With Its Founder No More Will Traveling Englishmen Exclaim at Its Wonders-Pullman is Now Humdrum Seburb.

Pullman, Ill., used to be a model town to look at. It is no longer good to look at; people who live there say that it's a better town to live in, but there's less fame in that. No more will traveling Englishmen exclaim at its wonders, or French monographists write learnedly of it without seeing it. The change of Pullman into an ordinary humdrum suburb is due partly to the extension of Chicago's city limits, but mainly to a decision of the Nlinois Supreme Court that the Pullman company was formed for building cars and not for landscape gardening, municipal government and the sale of cabbages and baking powder at retail.

The company has five years in which to sell such of its effects as do not concern the making of cars. Two of the three parks are destroyed and the tracks of the Illinois Central Railroad run across the famous athletic field, once one of the finest in the country. The stone wall and gate that once

fenced in the town are removed. All its streets are a part of the Chicago system now: The Pullman Gas Company has been sold to the Chicago Gas Trust, the city has taken over the water-pipes and the steam-heating may go out of business

The residents are getting gas, water and groceries cheaper-for Chicago marketmen can now sell at their doors -but they are a little nervous about the prospects of getting along without steam heat.

A new company will probably be formed to take the residences and unused land under a charter that will permit these functions. But the old Pullman Company is going to / build cars and nothing else. The model village is a model no more.

As a superintendent says:
"The company has no more consideration for its employees than the employees have for the company. It was their complaint that brought about the outrageous attack upon Mr. Pullman and ended in the decree of the Supreme Court.

"They got what they demanded from the State, and why should they expect the company to continue the violation of its charter by maintaining parks for them? The company needs the land and will put it to use.' So Pullman as a model town dies

with its founder.

Cannibals Who Eat Meg.

Cannibalism is still fairly common in Africa, in spots.
Usually the eating of human flesh is a part of the horrid ceremonial of strange secret societies, such as the 'Human Leopards" of Sierra Leone. Other tribes take to man-eating during famine and don't like to give it up. The Good Bishop Colenso tells this

"Not long ago there was a great famine in Natal through a drought, and Umdava, chief of the Ama Mbambo, told his people to scatter themselves and go over the veldt, and ch all the people they came upon in the paths to serve as food. They did so, and those people lived on human flesh till the time for the crops came round; but then they did not choose to leave their cannibalism, for they were now used to human flesh and liked it better than beef.'

Finally the account continues, the cannibals fied to the wilds of the Drakensberg where the great Basuto chief, Moshesh, finally brought them to terms. There is still living a chief named Nomsimekwana, who when a boy was marched away to be slaughtered by these Amazimu. As they were crossing the Umsindusi River the lad dove into the water and hid until his captors thought he had been eaten by alligators.

It is said that some white travellers indirectly encourage cannibalism along the upper Congo by employing Manyema porters and bargaining with them to feed themselves.

Tracing the Real Mayflower Folk.

The Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants is making arrangements, through its Committee on Historical Research, for a systematic examination of English and Dutch re-cords, with a view to obtaining infor-mation about the Mayflower passengers

and their ancestors.

It is proposed to employ an exper genealogist. Ifving in England and familiar with the English records, to make researches in such locations as are indicated by present knowledge of the Pilgrims. This expert will be furnished with every item of information which can in any way give a clue to the ancestry or former home of any of the Mayflower passengers. He will also. have data concerning the passengers of the Fortune, the Anne and the Little James, and will be instructed to preserve all material relating to them which may come to his attention. All persons interested in the Pilgrims should send to George Earnest Bowman, secretary general of the May-flower Descendants, information which they may possess relating to the ancestry of the Mayflower passengers. The examination of the Dutch records will be conducted on the same plan as that proposed for the English ones. The expense of these researches will be great, and the Massachusetts society has appropriated \$250 to start a fund for carrying on the work. It is noped to raise over \$6,000, and Mayflower descendants are asked for subscriptions. This sum will insure thorough

When it was the custom to kill one or more beef cattle on the farm every fall, says The American Cultivator, we could not save the waste and offal from them as do the great packing houses who boast that their profits come from such savings, but we did save one part which many threw away or buried. The hoofs and feet as cut off by the butcher when skinning were saved and put to soak for a few days, then scrubbed clean and put in a kettle to boil They were boiled slowly for some hours and then set away to settle. Before the fat hardened the fat and oil were taken off and put in another kettle, which was allowed boil for awhile until nearly all the water was evaporated. Then it was cooled until the fat hardened, which was taken off for soap grease, while the oil which did not harden was turned off and strained. If much water remained in it, it might be boiled again till the water was all out of it, and there would be nearly a quart, if we remember rightly, of pure neatsfoot oil, from a set of feet that we thought was the best oil to be had for oiling boots and shoes, harnesses or any leather that we wanted soft, pliable and weather
