Britain's War Fleet.

The capital value of Britain's wa beet has been enormously increased by recent additions—not merely by the number of ships built, but by the great growth in the cost of individual ships, consequent upon increase in size, speed, and fighting capability. Taking the combatant ships of the British navy, their total first costs (according to Engineering) have represented about the following at the respective periods: 1813, 16 millions sterling; 1860, 17 to 18 millions; 1868, a somewhat higher figure; 1878, about 28 millions; 1887, 37 millions; 1902, about 100 millions, Guns and ammunition are not included. The value of the French fiathonal fleet in 1870 was put at 184 millions sterling, and in 1898 at 474 millions—a great increase, but a slower rate of increase, but a slower rate of growth than that of the Royal navy.


