Brown Six-Row Potato Sprayer

BROWN POTATO SPRAYERS have for several years been the favorite with the potato growers on the St. John river for the reason that the glog proof nozzle makes it possible for the operator to spray for hours without stopping to clean the nozzles.

THE HUNDRED GALLON TANK is square and of cypress wood, with the top removable in case of any trouble in the tank, whereas with the barrel tank sprayer it is impossible to do this.

THE WHEELS ARE GENUINE SARVIAN WHEELS, 4 feet in diameter, with 3 inch tire, all of good material that will stand for years which is very necessary in a sprayer that is to carry 100 gallons.

THE AXLE is cold roll steel 1 3/4 inch in diameter and we have never yet known one to break.
