Flagstaff, Ariz.—Down here in the great Painted Desert man beleaguers by the suffragist hosts may find fully illustrated the fate that will be his when the woman's rights movement reaches its fullest fruition. Long before the beserked women of the East even thought about demanding the ballot their blanketed sisters in the Hopi Indian nation had fought out the matter and won.

The Hopis are better known to fame as the Mokis or Moquis, but this latter appellation was bestowed upon "them" in derision by their warlike Navaho and Apache enemies. Hopi means people of peace. "Moqui" means "dead men."
