We again draw attention to the failure of the Government to supply a record of the state of the foreign markets to which our staple is shipped. The Premier has promised fishermen a weekly report in order that Fish Markets in Brazil they may have a basis of facts on which to form a fair and reasonable opinion as to the prices which should prevail locally

Mr. Piccott, the Minister of Fisher ies, has had this project in hand, and steady." has failed signally to supply regularly information from our chief markets which is of any practical value Why he should fail is a matter of comment. Considerable information is published weekly in New York by the Fishing Gazette. Why the Government cannot get it as speedily as the New York Fishing Gazette is remarkable. In the issue of September prices quoted in the New York wholesale market, for Newfoundland, large Maderia, 112 lbs., \$8.00 to \$9.00; Newfoundland, Porto Rico butts in bond, \$32.00 to \$33.00; Newfoundland, Rio, tubs, c.i.f., \$9.70 to \$10.00.

We also notice the report of Holmwood & Holmwood, of the Oporto Fish market, dated Aug. 17th.; S. Ramerez & Co.'s weekly report of the Porto Rico Fish Market, dated San Juan, Aug. 22nd. Besides these there are reports from Havana, St. John's, Nfld., St. John, N.B., Halifax, etc.

This goes to show that information is available if proper steps are taken to secure it

Why, then, have Premier Morris and Minister Piccott failed in their undertaking?
