

Bible Society Meeting.

AUDIENCE AT COLLEGE
SIR W. L. ALLARDYCE
MAKES FIRST PUBLIC APPEARANCE.

The special meeting of the friends of the Bible Society, held last night in the Methodist College Hall, was attended by a very large audience. The meeting was opened with the appearance of Sir Wm. Allardyce and he was accompanied by Mrs. Allardyce, Miss Allardyce, and Mr. Goodfellow.

Canon Bolt, D.C.L., President of the Newfoundland Auxiliary, presided and the meeting opened with the singing of "From All That Dwell in the Skies." A portion of scripture was read by Rev. T. B. Darby, after which came a solo by Miss Thee, Lord's, pleasingly rendered by Mr. Stansfield.

After explaining that the meeting was for the purpose of increasing the funds of the Bible Society, the chairman stated that he did not expect the present annual contribution to be from \$1,500 to \$2,000 as adequate for this Colony. Announcing a new system of collecting he appealed to the audience, Canon Bolt, extended a wholehearted welcome to Sir Wm. Allardyce, and expressed his confidence in his Excellency that he was among a people second to none in their loyalty to the throne.

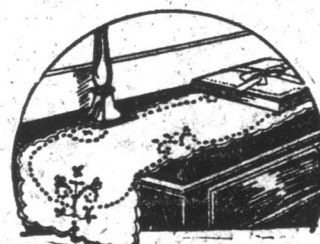

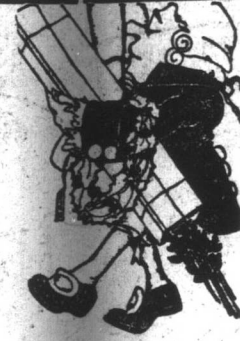
