UNIQUE CEREMONY.

A ceremony unique in the history of the London home of our royal family was celebrated at Buckingham Palace on June 24. The King, who is the Sovereign Head of the Grand Priory of the Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem in England, held an Investiture for the members of the Order. The ceremony was quaint and fascinating, being held in the white and gold ballroom.

The King and Queen, the Prince of Wales, the Duchess of York and Lord Lascelles, the Duke of Connaught, Prince Arthur, Princess "Pat," and Princesses Beatrice and Helene Victoria formed some of the royal party. The ceremony started with a procession, among whom were Field Marshal the Duke of Connaught, who is Grand Prior. After him came the Chaplin-Generals in black cloaks, the sub-prelates who are Bishops, and the Archbishop of Canterbury who is Prelate; then the sub-prior, the Earl of Shaftesbury, the Knights of Justice, Knights of Grace, Ladies of Justice and Grace, and finally Honorary Serving Brothers and Sisters.
