#### PRETTY CLOSE TO THE BIG RECORDS

Bainton Made 6 ft. 6 in. in The Pole Vault—Some Other Very Good Work at Y. M. C. A.

The indoor athletic contest for the Canada Y.M.C.A. championships was held last evening at the Y.M.C.A.

The events in this contest are decided upon points, which were sent to the Y.M.C.A. at Toronto. The highest average are Dominion champions. Points are given for first, second and third place. Last evening the local athletes did exceedingly well. Murray in the high jump obtained 90 out of a possible 100. Bainton also obtained 90 on the fence vault. This contestant cleared 6 feet 6 inches and was only two inches short of the Canadian record.

The scores obtained were: Pole vault, 90, 50, 40; total 180. Running high jump, 76, 54, 56; total 186. S. B. jump, 73, 68, 67; total 207. 60 yard, potato, 25, 25, 20; total 70. Shot put, 64, 61, 51; total 186. 440 yds. Potato, 8, 8, 8; total 24. The Calgary association would have stood good chance of being high up but for their poor showing in the two potato relay races. In these they fell a long way below the average, thus affecting their gross total. The results were as follows:

### THE BIGGEST HORSE SHOW IN DOMINION

The Entry List Surpasses Any Other Show Ever Held in Canada—Some of The Features

The Calgary Horse Show which opens on April 5 will be the largest horse show that has been held in the Dominion of Canada.

There are 220 entries in for the big event and the closest to this number reached by any other show held in Canada was that of the Vancouver Horse Show of last year, the entries numbering 220.

All arrangements have been completed, Manager Richardson yesterday making arrangements for the floor, which last year caused some trouble.

On the floor of Sherman's Rink where the show is to be held, paper will first be laid on the floor. Then one inch boards, and on top of the boards four or five inches of earth covered with one and a half inches of sawdust.

Mr. Richardson states that this will give a dirt floor as good as any floor in the country and that horses in making a jump will be able to get a good take off, all danger of slipping being eliminated.

There are two Kentucky bred stallions among the entries. These horses come from the Cardston district and are the Sals and Tigra, a chance to be shown in Calgary.

There is also an Irish hunter stallion coming from Ontario. This is an important horse and the first of his class to be shown here.

### CALGARY LACROSSE MEETING WEDNESDAY

Wednesday evening next is the date fixed for the Calgary lacrosse club's annual meeting. This has been practically decided upon by President Higgins, Manager McDonald and Barney Colson. The club would have held their meeting some time ago, but held off to give the Sals and Tigra a chance to call their first. The Nationals, as this combined Sals-Tiger team will be called, will come off shortly. Steve Clancy who has charge of organizing the Nationals went out of town this week so that nothing will be done until after the Sals and Tigra have been held that practically all arrangements were made and that the Nationals would be in the game with a strong team.

Clancy has one or two eastern men who have lately arrived in the city. While these men are no wonders, they are good average lacrosse players and with the material already available Steve thinks he can get together the Nationals who will be strong enough to hold their own with McDonald's bunch.

It shows the money placed on all horses, and the odds in which the money has been placed. It is claimed for the system that it gives the public a square deal, besides all the information regarding horse racing has been placed on the horses entered. The Pari-Mutuel has been used extensively in Australia, but very little in Canada.
