**MACKENZIE KING**  
INVITED TO LONDON

**Rev. John G. Inkster Sends In-  
vitation to the Minister  
of Labor.**

Rev. John G. Inkster, of the First  
Presbyterian Church, is making a de-  
termined effort to secure several prom-  
inent labor leaders to speak in the  
city during the coming winter.

Mr. Inkster has taken a very de-  
cided part in the labor movements in  
the city, and has been particularly  
active in the work of the Civic Fed-  
eration, which was formed in this city  
last year. Mr. Inkster has written to  
the Hon. William Lyon Mackenzie  
King, to try and secure his services  
for an address on some phase of the  
labor problem, during the coming win-  
ter. Mr. Inkster and Mr. King were  
classmates at Toronto University, and  
close personal friends, and it is hoped  
that Mr. Inkster's influence will be  
sufficient to secure the services of the  
minister of labor. Mr. Inkster is also  
formulating plans leading to the  
bringing to the city of John Mitchell,  
the great American labor leader, and  
Seth Low, of New York.

## WALKER HARVEY DEAD.

Chicago, Sept. 13.—Turlington Walk-  
er Harvey, one of Chicago's pioneer  
lumbermen, and at one time the great-  
est lumber dealer in the world, died  
yesterday in a hospital in Littleton, N.  
H., of injuries caused by a fall six  
weeks ago while entering a ferry-  
boat in Jersey City. Of late years  
Mr. Harvey had lived in Marietta,  
Ohio, but more recently in New York  
City. He was 74 years old, and was  
born in Sileam, N. Y. Mr. Harvey  
came to Chicago in 1854 and engaged  
in the lumber business. In 1859 he  
built in Michigan the first logging  
railroad.
