The standing committees were struck as follows, the first name in each receiving the chairmanship: *Library committee*—Knowiton, Wright, Boswell, Hialman. *Finance*—Mason, Mills, Soully, Wright. Building —Mills, Soully, Hal-lam, Mason. The new chairman, who has been on the board since its inception, thanked the meeting for the honor con-ferred on him. He said in the event of a branch library being established in Park-dale, he supposed the citizens in the catrene east-end would also request one. A motion was offered by Mr. Boswell and carried directing that a return be faid on the table at the next meeting of the total number of employes in the library and its branches, their salaries, how long in the service and their daily hours of labor.


