The Rebel Yell. The Bowmanville News puts Irish Fenians, Irish land leaguers, and Canadian Independents in the same category. This is most unfair, but it is an old device of a class of people who, whenever they find themselves beaten in argument, yell "rebel!" and then run away. It must have been for of such unreasonable and unscrupulous critics that caused the Globe to suppress the names of the prominent young liberals who took part in the Albert hall meeting.

There are thousands of men, members of and sympathizers with the Fenian league, who have no sympathy with the political and social disabilities of Ireland's poor. When they travel outside of their own country, they are not to talk of their own country, but to talk of the common interests of the British Empire. Macdonald and Mr. Blake were judged by the opinions of their enemies, they would both have been in the penitentiary long ago.

When it takes place Great Britain will find in these provinces, upon whose departure she bestows a blessing, not the bitter enemies she made in the revolted thirteen colonies, but grown up daughters, proud of their friendship and true to it.

The Bowmanville bigot may yell "rebel!" at us as much as he pleases. It seems to hurt him to do so, and it certainly doesn't hurt us. The young men of Canada have spent too many nights in the bush to be scared by the howling of a dog. Say what you please of us, Mr. News, so long as you do not say that we are afraid of thinking for ourselves, or inappreciable of the things we think. The charlatans who would thought will think of more, no matter how many small souls pull backward on the spokes.
