SUPPRESSION OF ANARCHY

TO BE ACTIVELY UNDERTAKEN BY THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT.

this Announcement by the Minister of the Interior Greeted With Applause-Vaillant's Sympathizers Unfurl a Red Flag at His Grave-The Bomb-Thrower

Thought to Be English, PARIS, Feb. 13 .- In the Chamber of Deouties to-day M. Auguste Bouge, a Radical Republican, questioned the Government respecting the manifestations that have been allowed to be made at the grave of the executed bomb-thrower Vaillant. He made particular reference to the fact that the sympathizers with the dead Anarchiet had unfurled a red flag at the grave. What, he asked, is the Government doing to protect society? He declared that the threats of the Anarchists would be fol-

lowed by their fulfilment. lowed by their fulfilment.

M. Clovis-Hugues, Socialist, frequently interrupted the speaker, but M. Bouge paid little attention to him. Amid tremendous applause M. Bouge declared that the time had come for the Government to take action to suppress revolutionary manifestations, no matter who made them.

M. Raynal, Minister of the Interior, replied that the visits to Vaillant's grave had conty assumed a seditious character.
