

GIVES CAUSES FOR CANCER INCREASE

Woman's Refusal To Bear Children Is Factor.

MODERN LIVING METHODS

Dr. Hastings Gilford Admires Modern Woman, However.

LONDON, Nov. 12.—Woman's modern manner of living and her refusal to bear enough children or to bear them early enough is one of two major contributing factors to the increase of cancer in the civilized world, Dr. Hastings Gilford, formerly a professor of the Royal College of Surgeons, said on Wednesday in a lecture at the Royal Institute of Public Health.

The other major factor is the degeneration of the reproductive organs, which results from the civilized life, according to Gilford. He pointed out that rough living savages were virtually free from cancer.

Unlike most authorities who blame women and their ways for modern ills of one kind or another, Gilford admires modern women.

"The cause," he said, "of all our cancer trouble is inadequate use of the digestive and reproductive organs. The laws become smaller—in smooth case become rotten, the stomach becomes more readily upset, thus causing pyrosis, adenitis, tonsillitis, dyspeptic constipation, colitis and cancer. Women's reproductive organs, owing to insufficient functional exercise are undergoing a deteriorating process."

"With short hair, kill-like skirts, narrow hips and insignificant breasts, there has arrived a confident, active game-loving, capable human being who shuns the servitude of childbearing."

"Thus, although Gilford holds modern women to be admirable, he says they are the cause of degeneration in the feminine constitution."

"Can we wonder," he asked, "that the whole process of childbirth resembles a surgical operation and that cancer in women is more frequent?"

"Everyone hears what is tantamount to a conspiracy against the performance of woman's private duty of bearing children. There is among women what amounts to a strike against reproduction, which is as definite and even more disastrous than man's strike against reproduction."

"It is, therefore, above all necessary to bring home to women that the chief cause of this form of cancer is that they do not bear children at an early age and in large numbers. This view is supported by the fact that cancer of the breast is more likely to arise among married women, who have not suckled their children or who have not suckled them enough."

FIRST CONSIDERATION IS FOR RADIO LISTENER

U. S. Secretary Hoover Announces Policy at Washington Conference.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—(Associated Press Dispatch.)—In a speech containing broad recommendations for the solution of major problems in every branch of radio endeavor was adopted at the concluding session of the fourth national radio conference.

Containing recommendations for legislation covering radio regulations for sharply reducing the present number of broadcasting stations to relieve congestion and for the elimination of interfering elements in radio reception, the report was described by Secretary Hoover, chairman of the conference, to be the most far-reaching and constructive yet made.

He indicated that the proposals in the report for solution of various problems would become, in a general way, the temporary policy of his department in its regulation of radio communication, but expressed doubt as to the wisdom of placing such broad powers as were outlined in the hands of any one governmental office.

One of the most important actions of the conference was Mr. Hoover's opinion, was its declaration that service to the radio listener should be the prime consideration in all efforts of the industry and its regulations. He said no other industry had been brought up from its infancy with such an attitude.

Under the resolution adopted, no major alterations will be made in present wave length assignments, and minor changes will be confined almost entirely to the field outside the broadcasting band.

The legislative recommendations provided that administration of all radio legislation be vested in the secretary of commerce, with authority to appoint such advisory boards and committees as he might deem necessary, that the doctrine of free speech be held inviolate and that monopoly in the industry be prohibited and that broadcasting licenses be granted only to those who, in the opinion of the secretary, would render beneficial service to the public or contribute to the development of the art.

The president, under the program, would be given authority to commend or discontinue all broadcasting stations in time of national emergency, and decisions of the secretary of commerce could be appealed to the courts. Station call letters would be recognized by law as property rights during the life of broadcasting licenses, which the secretary could suspend or revoke when their holders had not lived up to their terms.

WIDOW OF COMMANDER OF ILL-FATED AIRSHIP IS CALLED BY DEFENSE

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 12.—Mrs. Zachary Lansdowne, widow of the late commander of the dirigible Shenandoah was called today as a defense witness in the court-martial trial of Col. Wm. Mitchell. Defense counsel sought to prove by her testimony that a navy officer endeavored to have her give false testimony before the Shenandoah board of inquiry by retracting her formal statement that Commander Lansdowne was ordered to take the Shenandoah on her final flight to the Middle West over her protest.

Representative Frank E. Reid, chief defense counsel, said her evidence also would support Mitchell's charge that the navy department had been guilty of "criminal negligence"—one of the accusations which led to his trial.

County police yesterday were notified that dogs in Manor Park are being shot in surprisingly large numbers by unknown persons. The complaint was made by Justice of the Peace Taylor on behalf of owners.
