

Intelligence from China, dated May 24. has been received. It states that Mr. Consul. Alcock had succeeded in the coercive measures he had adopted, and obtained satisfaction from the Chinese authorities at Shanghai, for the outrage on the English mission-aries. The culprits, ten in number, are to aries. wear the cangue for one month, at the spot where the offence occurred, as a' warning to the multitude ; and when the time expires they will be beaten, and be thus disposed of. Perfect tranquillasy prevailed throughout China.
