China Preparing for War.

San Francisco, Aug. 1.—Last Thursday five cases of smallpox and arms were sent on the Pacific Mail steamship Comstock. The smallpox cases, all of them in the Government, 45 in all, and all the cases were from Springfield, Mass. It is now asserted that during the next six months regular shipments on an extensive scale have been made to C. Schmidt, Shanghai, during that period 24,000 Springfield rifles and 25,000,000 cartridges in all have been forwarded, besides from 300 to 500 boxes of cotton duck suitable for tents were sent by express by steamer for China. The total value of the war material is estimated at \$3,000,000.
