Like the epidemics of this disease we have had for the last fifteen or twenty years the type was mild and often so much so that some were apt to question the diagnosis and attempt to call it something else.

REPORT OF MEDICAL HEALTH OFFICER

To W. G. Clarke, Esq., Warden, Municipality of Annapolis County: Sir:—I herewith present my annual report as Medical Health Officer for the Municipality.

The general health has been good and we have again been greatly favored in freedom from any serious epidemic or contagious disease. The summer and fall was unusually dry and parts of the county, depending on wells for water supply, suffered much inconvenience from shortage of domestic supply of water.

Early in the year a few cases of mild Smallpox developed at Dalhousie West; we were able to keep the disease to the family where we found it and very little inconvenience to the rest of the community was occasioned, as the children in the school district had been all vaccinated the year previous and school was continued without interruption.

Shortly after this an outbreak of the same disease occurred at Lower Granville which was of much more seriousness as far as the two sections of Victoria Beach and Port Wade were concerned. In this epidemic the first cases were not recognized or reported until they had spread a route of several miles through the district.

Councillor Casey, realizing that they had something unusually contagious, called me to his Ward, and as Dr. Chisholm, of the Provincial Health Department, happened to be in the county at the time he accompanied me to Lower Granville, where we found a number of families infected with Smallpox and none of them under control. A mail driver was performing his duties over a route of several miles with the disease very marked on his hands and face.

I found it necessary to spend several days in the district carrying out these measures and believe we were successful in limiting the disease very much by vaccination and rigid isolation of the sick. Quite a number of the cases in this epidemic were loathsome to look upon and quite severe, and they were near enough to the roadside to be seen by everybody passing by, so we heard nothing under these conditions of people saying they would as soon have the disease as to be vaccinated; that nonsense was forgotten during those days and people everywhere were quite willing to avail themselves of every means to assist in the control of this serious epidemic.
