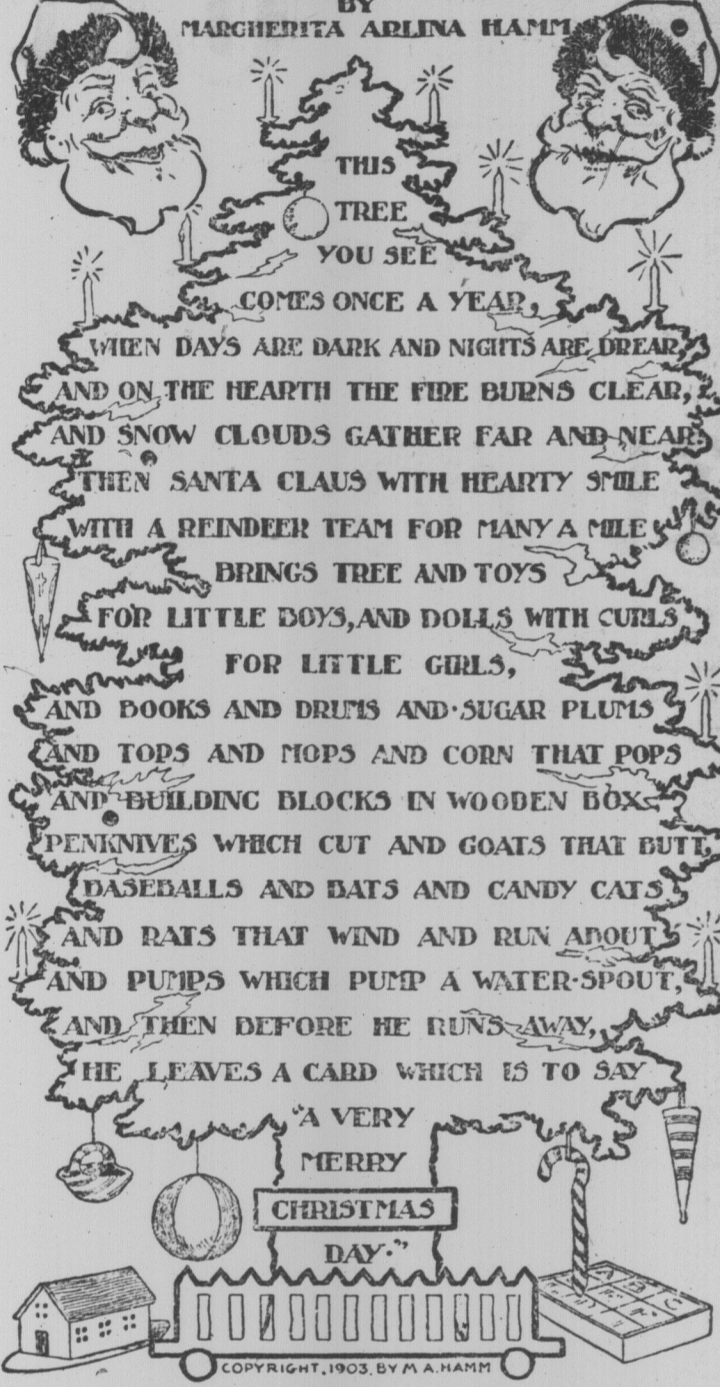
"How can I help?" Melissa's bewilderment was plain. "Logan would not let me have a hand in those beautiful sermons, and—"
