at Mount Caucafus in Tartary, and in North America, fay there are people at Caucafus, who fpeak a language fimilar to that of fome American Indians.--The Tartars are divided into tribes, and practife circumcifion.

A part of the Ten Tribes may have continued in Arfareth; as well as Tartary, and a part may have past over from the continent of Alia to that of America, at Beering's or Cook's Straits. ---It is faid in Ledyard's account of Captain Cook's voyage, that these Straits are but fourteen leagues over; about twice the breadth of the Straits of Dover. It is mentioned in Cook's last voyage that there are fome Islands. named Diomede, about the middle of these Straits, which are alternately visited by the inhabitants of both continents. Many have gone from one continent to the other in open boats.

An interesting work was published in London in 1775, entitled, "History of the American Indians, particularly those nations adjoining the Missifisippi, East and West Florida, Georgia, South
