named to the Secretary, (who will be in attendance at the Umon Hotel in Guelph), previous to the hour of Four o'clock, on the Friday preceding the day of Exhibition, or the owner forfeit a quarter dollar for each lot named afterwards. L. The Secretary

will be happy to receive entries of Stock on any occasion previous to the hour mentioned, either by letter, (post paid), or other-7th. Stock entered and not on the ground,

(which will be pointed out by the Secretary) by the hour of ten o'clock, on the morning of the Exhibition, will be considered meligible to compete.

8th. No Premium to be awarded for which there is not two or more competitors. In great merit, in any lot, or single animal, this rule may be suspended.

9th. No person eligible to obtain a Prem-bition. 10th. No person shall receive more than

one Premum for the same class of animals. 11th. The Judges shall be procured from without the limits of the District. 12th. No person shall be allowed, in any
