Nobel Peace Prize 1930

February 7, 1930

My dear Sir Arthur:

I am sending you a copy of a letter from Dean Pound, which has been forwarded to me by President Cowling of Carleton College, Minnesota. He asked me to write to the Nobel Committee in support of the nomination of Mr. F. B. Kellogg for the Nobel Peace Prize in December 1930. That I have done.
