Full Moon.

This Table shews the time of high water ashore, of which circumstance all masters of vessels ought to be well aware when they remove their vessels from one place to another; but the ebbing continues three quarters of an hour in the Channel.

RULE. Having found the age of the moon at the top of each month in the Calendar, look in the left column of the table for the day from new to the full moon, then in the right column the day from the full to the new moon, and in the middle column you will find the time when it is high water ashore.

EXAMPLE. The New Moon being on the 1st of January 1794, on the 10th of the same month, her age will be 9 days. In the middle column opposite to 9, the moon's age, you will find 11. 57m. which is the time at which it will be high water on that day, as also on the 25th of the month, when the moon's age will be 24 days, as appears opposite in the right hand column.
