the place, yet there is room for improvement; and I trust that ere long those who are now negligent will appreciate fully the value of the means of grace provided by God for them.

· Nine candidates were confirmed on 24th June, of whom six came to first communion. The number of communicants is now sixteen, whom may the giver of all grace help to be regular, and make faithful soldiers and servants unto their lives' end.

The debt of sixty dollars on the Church building has been paid. There is a hundred dollars of mortgage on the Church land, which we shall struggle to clear off this winter. If the gentle reader should think it ought to be no struggle to pay so small a sum, I would solicit a visit to this place, assured that he will not depart without leaving something more than good wishes.

I am sorry our contributions to the various funds of the Church Society are below what I anticipated; but I see good reason to hope for better things by-and-by, and so shall go on expecting.

Lastly, I would take this opportunity of tendering thanks to the Rev. C. P. Reid, Rev. I. M. Thompson, and Ed. J. Harper, Esq., of Lennoxville University, for services kindly done during my three months' absence from the Mission.
