Runnymede Ratepayers Met Last Night to Discuss the Change.

A crowded meeting in the King George School, St. John's road, Runnymede, listened last night to further explanations, by R. Home Smith and Controller McCarthy, of the annexation situation.

Up till a few weeks ago, he had taken no active part in any agitation. The motion of expediency having been passed, it was "up to" the residents of Scarlett Plains, Swansea, and Runnymede to come in, if they desired, on the most advantageous terms possible.

He had never forced the question, but at the Swansea meeting he had taken part, and had provided copies of the petition he had had prepared.

Only Opportunity. "If the proposal falls down now, he concluded, you will never get the opportunity of coming in except under special terms, such as paying the full cost of local improvements.

By the end of 1914, he said, only two to four miles of streets out of the 512 or 515 in the city would remain unpaved. Certain new areas taken in, however, with the tremendous works entailed, had raised the whole question of annexation, and the council had refused to take in new areas requiring large expenditure.
