## **LIVE STOCK AND DAIRYING**

(a) We approve of the action of the Saskatchewan Government in appointing a Commission to inquire into the various problems relating to the marketing of live stock and meat products. Means should be provided with the financial assistance of the Government, if necessary, to secure greater returns for the producer through improved shipping, marketing and storing facilities.

The importance of fostering and encouraging this industry needs no argument. Our agricultural stability from now on is certain to depend more and more upon diversified farming. It is for this reason that the Liberal Government some time ago appointed a Commission to inquire fully into all matters pertaining to the marketing of live stock, including the establishment of stock yards, abattoirs and cold storage plants. By this plank in its platform the Liberal party has declared that the Government should take whatever steps are necessary to aid the producer to get larger returns and at the same time protect the consumer. As a result of the inquiry now being conducted, it is anticipated the Martin Government will be enabled to institute reforms and adopt policies that will have far reaching results for producers and consumers alike.

(b) Further development of the dairying industry by encouraging the establishment of additional creameries, particularly in outlying settlements that are suitable for the purpose, by aiding a larger number of farmers to increase their dairy herds and by assisting all creameries to operate their plants and market their products at the lowest possible cost.

In the past twelve years excellent progress has been made in building up our dairy industry. No fault can be found with what has already been accomplished. The Department of Agriculture is to be heartily congratulated on the results attained. We must, however, not stand still. The possibilities for further useful work in this field are fully recognized and by this declaration the Liberal party has clearly indicated its desire that the Government should by every means in its power encourage and assist every phase of our dairy industry.
