The following observations on the Route of Our Great National Work, have been hurriedly written amidst the pressure of other duties, and are submitted to the public at the present time, in the hope that they will have the effect of drawing attention to the importance of selecting for the Intercolonial Railway that route over which the road can be most cheaply built,—that will open up the largest section of Country, develope the most important resources, promote the interests of the greatest number of inhabitants, and conduce to the general welfare of the Dominion.
