

UNION STATION NOT WANTED

Strong Opposition From Citizens Against Proposal for Joint Depot of C.N.R. and C.P.R. at North Bay.

OTTAWA, Aug. 22.—(Can. Press.)—Strong opposition to an application made by His Lordship Bishop Scollard and Messrs. Norris and Casselman of North Bay and others, that the Canadian Northern Railway and Canadian Northern Railway companies be ordered to build a union depot at that point, was heard before the board of railway commissioners this afternoon.

WILLS PROBATED

Miss Annie M. Steers of Marlboro, N. J., formerly of Toronto, left Ontario property valued at \$2500 to her sister, who resides at Marlboro.

DIRTY RESTAURANT

Charles Lewis Fined \$10 Without Costs and Paid Fines.

Another restaurant keeper was fined in the police court yesterday. Inspector Hegworth of the medical health department found meat in the eating house owned and run by Charles Lewis at 66 East Queen-street kept with the hot water from fish kept above cooking on it. There was no drainage. Swarms of flies infested the kitchen and the floor was in a very dirty condition.

TO COST \$15,000,000

Double Tracking of C.N.R. From Port Arthur and Portage la Prairie.

Announcement has been made by the Canadian Northern Railway that the double-tracking of the C. N. R. between Portage la Prairie, west of Winnipeg, and Port Arthur, will be started next spring and the work rushed to completion. The surveys for the project which will involve an expenditure of \$15,000,000, have already been completed.

INTERCONTINENTAL HAVING BIG YEAR

Commissioner F. D. Brady Declares Present is Most Successful One in History of the Road.

MONTREAL, Aug. 22.—(Can. Press.)—"We are looking forward to the present year as the most successful in the history of the Intercontinental Railway," declared F. P. Brady, member of the Intercontinental board of commissioners, who is in Montreal to-day on his regular trip of inspection over the line. Mr. Brady said that the business of the road, both passenger and freight, has never been better than it has the present season, and both men and rolling stock are hard put to handle the business.

COSTLY TRIAL OF STRENGTH

Amazonian Waitress Wins \$105 in Hand Opening Feat.

MONTREAL, Aug. 22.—(Can. Press.)—A misplaced confidence in his own strength cost Arthur Catzaro \$105 last month, a sum which he cannot recover according to a ruling handed down in the recorder's court to-day. Mary Siga, an Amazonian waitress, profits accordingly.

Catzaro entered an east end restaurant July 1 and clenching his hand over a \$5 bill offered to wager the waitress who was serving him \$5 to \$1 she could not force open his hand and extract the bill. The waitress promptly accepted the offer and quite as promptly relieved him of the bill. He then put five \$5 bills in his hand and bet that sum against the \$5 the waitress had won that she could not repeat the feat. Thereupon she took away his hundred. She refused to believe him when he declared that "he was only fooling," and he immediately had her arrested for theft. The recorder, however, couldn't see it that way.

FREE ON TECHNICALITY

Dr. Noble Gets Out of Montreal Insane Asylum on Error in Papers.

MONTREAL, Aug. 21.—(Can. Press.)—Dr. Charles Noble, the Philadelphia physician, who has been confined since June 24 in the Verdun Insane Asylum, was granted his release this afternoon by Justice Demers on a writ of habeas corpus.

The judge did not dwell at all on the supposed mental condition of the plaintiff, but gave his judgment in favor of the release of the petitioner on an account of a technical error in the commitment papers on which Dr. Noble had been confined. Counsel for the asylum authorities asked for time to have the error corrected, but the judge refused a delay. He stated that Noble, being an American, could if he were later proved insane, be attended to in the institutions of his own country, and if he were sane he was at liberty to choose his own place of residence.

Bell Phones in London Increase.

LONDON, Aug. 22.—(Can. Press.)—The Bell Telephone Company has closed contracts for an addition to their present building on Park-avenue, rather more than doubling the size of it. The growth of the city is such that it has been decided to install a new telephone equipment with an ultimate capacity of ten thousand subscribers' lines.

The addition will have a frontage of about 42 feet, will be 100 feet deep and three stories and basement in height, designed to carry another storey in the future.
