He said that so far as he was able to discover from the Canadian returns the contraction of preference in prefer in every case of preference in regard to dutiable goods the result had been to arrest the decrease of importation into Canada of British goods, and to turn the decrease into an increase. He wanted to know if the government was noting events in Canada, because all agreed that promotion of trade with Canada would be mutually advantageous.

Lord Granard, agreeing on behalf of the board of trade to give the figures, said there was no doubt that previous to the establishment of the Canadian tariff the general tendency of our trade with Canada was to diminish, but since 1896-7 there had been a gradual increase of imports, not only from this country, but from nearly all countries into Canada. It was really a case of general prosperity. The increase in imports from this country might have been greater but for the effect of the Canadian tariff, which tended to discourage the importation of manufactured goods more than the importation tured goods more than the importation of raw materials.

of population consumed three times as much goods as did the population of Canada in 1904-5. British goods to the Canada in 1904-5. British goods to the value of £2 4s per head of population were consumed by Canada—the corresponding figures for Australia being £5 12s, and for New Zealand £8 17s. Canada exported to this country in 1904-5 goods of her own production to the value of £24,000,000. She imported from us in the same year goods valued at £12,500,000. Canada imported goods worth £31,000,000 from the United States, and exported to that country products worth £14,000,000. Thus on the whole we were a better customer for whole we were a better customer for Canadian products than Canada was for United Kingdom products—the reverse being the case with the trade between the United States and Canada.
