Our trim little steamer comes to an anchor on the left shore, while, in a primitive fashion, a beautiful spring lalling from the heights above supplies it with water. Here the deep foliage touches the river on each side, lining its winding banks and reflecting rich colors in the grand depths of its sea-green waters. Blue jays, king-lishers and sheldrakes fly ahead to a refuge among the islands in the lake-like expansion of the river we are now approaching. The channel, however, has to be closely followed, as the water on each side, though wide, is shallow, Here is seen one of the strangest of all sea birds, and the most graceful on the wing except the soaring abbatross; it is the Steering gull. Its wings are long and pointed, enabling it to perform the most varied and beautiful evolutions, in which, like the albatross, it appears to take the greatest delight. Twelve miles up from the mouth of the river, on the south side, is Trout Brook, which, as its name implies, is a famous place for fishing. There are many other places further up the stream where fine trout can also be had.

The Albert Bridge is next reached, where the smoke stack is lowered to pass under it. Nine miles further is the Marion Bridge, around which is a comfortable-looking settlement, with a postoffice and two stores. It is a pretty place in many ways, and has an air


