Hohenlohe's Regrets. Hohenlohe's Regrets. Prince Hohenlohe, the Imperial Chancel-lor, said he sincerely regretted that the Emperor's speech had been introduced in the debate. The speech, he added, had been called forth by the political situation. It was an expression of solicitude from the monarch for the power and prestige of the fatherland. In view of the eminent po-sition which the King of Prussia occupied as German Emperor, his right to exhort his people to unity in order to achieve great ends and give expression to his wishes could not be contested.
