## ACCIDENT AT INGERSOLL.

**Wagon Struck By G. T. R. Train**  
—Driver's Narrow Escape.

Ingersoll, Nov. 29.—As the result of a collision at the G.T.R. crossing leading to William Ross' coal yard this morning, Alex. Grant's wagon was smashed into kindling wood, and Ed. Iles, the driver, had a narrow escape from instant death. Mr. Iles was driving over the crossing, and just as the horses reached the track the yard engine, which was doing some shunting in that part of the yard, came along. The driver and horses were caught by the cowcatcher and carried along the track about twenty-five feet. The driver was dragged along between the cars and Mr. Ross' coal shed. The wagon was smashed to pieces and a portion torn out of the side of the building. The horses and driver escaped serious injuries, but eye-witnesses of the accident say that Mr. Iles' escape from death was nothing short of miraculous.

**LOSS \$750,000.**

New York, Nov. 29.—The fire which started yesterday afternoon in the lumber yards of William E. Uptegrove & Bros., at the foot of East Tenth and Eleventh streets, burned all night. The fire on the Standard Oil property was extinguished late in the night. The total loss was estimated to-day at \$750,000.
