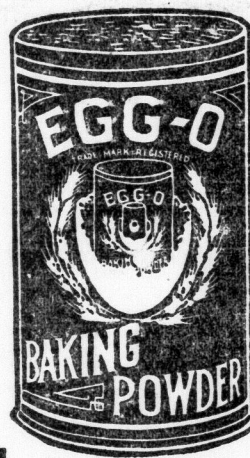

SAM HUGHES ASKING HOUSE TO VINDICATE HIRSCH, M'CAULEY

Gives Notice of Resolution To Parliament.

WOULD KEEP PATRONAGE

Sam Is Anxious To Have
"Spoils" System Retained
For Civil Service.

(Special to The Advertiser.)

OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—The order paper for the coming session is already adorned with several interesting items. G. H. Burnham, M. P. for West Peterboro, has a resolution calling for a full and free discussion of the "desperate conditions" arising out of the high cost of living and the price of fuel. General Sir Sam Hughes, from the hospital at Toronto, has sent in a resolution calling upon the House to vindicate the action taken by Major Hirsch and Capt. McCauley in connection with the Guelph Novitiate raid. The resolution claims that these men acted to the letter upon the instructions of their superiors and that their action in every case was satisfactory, tact and discretion being used towards the parties immediately concerned.

Resolution on Patronage.
General Hughes has another resolution on patronage, which reads as follows: "That in the opinion of this House the people would be served and the principles of responsible government would be maintained by a system of political patronage wherein appointments to and promotion in both the outside and inside civil service would be brought under the specific consideration and recommendation of members of parliament or the defeated candidates of the party in power, always having due regard for the ability of the service, the promotion of deserving officers, and the proper conduct of the business of the country, and that the civil service should be amended in conformity therewith, and also to place the service commission in an unequivocal position consistent with its dignity and importance in a new sphere of action."

Who is Col. Cooper?
J. H. Sinclair of Guelph desires to know whether it is the Government's intention to restore the law making bank notes redeemable by gold. He also wants to know "who is Colonel John A. Cooper, who in an interview purporting to have been given to the Boston Globe, declared himself to be the first representative of the Canadian Government ever sent to a foreign country."

SATURNIA DOCKS WITH CANADIAN SOLDIERS

HALIFAX, N. S., Feb. 23.—The Anchor-Donalson liner Saturnia arrived in port early this morning after a ten-day trip from Glasgow. On board were 400 soldiers and 400 third-class passengers, all of whom landed here. Before proceeding to Portland she will discharge about 1,000 tons of wheat, including over 27,000 cases of whiskey. The steamer brought a party of 25 Canadian soldiers to be demobilized and destined for Upper Canada and western points. Two special trains left this afternoon with the Saturnia's passengers.

MacLean, administrator of the Manitoba temperance act, today. His statement was to the effect that as long as a person did not store liquor for exportation there was no objection to their shipping the liquor out of the province.

REFERS TO BRUTAL INHUMAN TREATMENT RECEIVED BY MAYOR

Retiring Mayor of Dublin
Speaks At Installation.

DUBLIN, Feb. 23.—The city corporation met today to install the new lord mayor, Tom Kelly, after his recent release from the Wormwood Scrubbs prison, is now ill in a London nursing home.

The outgoing lord mayor, Laurence O'Neill, in an address, dwelt on the brutal and inhuman treatment meted out to Kelly by the British Government, awakening even among the most moderate a growing sensation of revenge. He said: "I would, pending Kelly's recovery, console him and conduct the duties of lord mayor in accordance with Kelly's wishes."

The corporation cleansing committee announced that it would not apply for permits for its employees to be on the streets after midnight and therefore scavenger work would not be done as usual because of the recent decree ordering that all persons must remain in doors between midnight and 5 o'clock. The corporation it was declared, does not intend to light the streets during the hours when citizens are forbidden by the Government to use the thoroughfares.

WATERFORD, Ireland, Feb. 23.—Ald. Dr. White wore a robe of green, white and gold, the Irish Republican colors, when he was installed as lord mayor today. The new mayor ordered the ancient mace consigned to another room, deprecating it as a "symbol of English domination."

HON. A. K. M'LEAN QUITS GOVERNMENT

Declares That Union Has
Ceased To Exist.

(Special to The Advertiser.)

OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—Hon. A. K. McLean has retired from the Union Government. The reason which he gives is that his "contract" entered into in 1917 has expired, that the war "and a reasonable period thereafter" is over, and that there is no reasonable excuse for his further continuance as a member of the administration or as a supporter of a "union" which has no intent and purposes ceased to exist.

Mr. McLean entered the Government in 1917. He did not take a portfolio, and was appointed chairman of the reconstruction committee of the cabinet, and allotted \$7,000 a year under the war appropriation fund. At the end of last year, after having held a large number of "acting" ministries, he refused to take any further emolument, and has now resigned entirely from the Government. He has not had any salary since the end of the year.

Some months ago Hon. P. B. Carvell decided that his "contract" was up and retired. His retirement, however, was to a position of ten years period at \$12,500 a year. Later on, Sir John G. D. Newburn, minister of militia, also decided that his "contract" was up and retired to his practice in Hamilton. He got nothing for doing so, however.

Now then, Mr. Hon. A. K. McLean, Hon. A. Calder, Right Hon. C. C. Bellamy, Liberal Unionists, who declared in 1917 "for the period of the war and a reasonable period thereafter," but who appear to be ready to hold on for a more indefinite period thereafter.

JORDAN WATER FOR PRINCESS PATS' SON

LONDON, Feb. 22.—King George, Queen Mary and a number of members of the royal family attended the christening of the son of Commander Alexander Ramsay and Lady Ramsay, formerly Princess Patricia of Connaught, at the Chapel Royal this afternoon.

The water used in christening the infant was drawn from the Jordan by the Duke of Connaught when the British crossed the river in the advance of 1917.

DISSOLVE ASSEMBLY.
SOFIA, Bulgaria, Feb. 23.—(Havas.)—The Government today decreed dissolution of the Sobranje, or national assembly, because of differences caused by the Socialists.

UNION GOVERNMENT IS ONE OF TINKERS, SAYS BOB ROGERS

Predicts a Crisis As a Result
of Maladministration.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 23.—(Canadian Press).—"Canada's industrial and economic conditions have reached a most critical period in the history of our existence," said Hon. Robert Rogers, who addressed here tonight in the Fort Garry Hotel an open meeting of the Conservative Club of Winnipeg, declaring that he had "no further political aspirations to gratify" and that he proposed to speak plainly.

Mr. Rogers declared the Union Government to be a "government of tinkers and jobbers," a government of second-hand dealers, whose energies almost entirely devoted to second-hand theories that are the product of the diseased brain of some poor unfortunate uplifter."

Traditional Policy.
Mr. Rogers declared himself a "last-believer in the traditional policy that has ever governed the actions of the Conservative party in this Dominion." Union Government might have been necessary during the war, but in peace it was a different thing. "I confess," said Mr. Rogers, "that

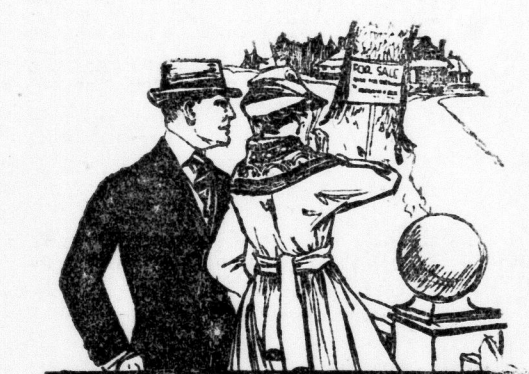
