CHAIRMAN BURNABY CALLS SPECIAL MEETING

N. Toronto Councillors Talk Over Town Matters—Birch Cliff Forms Association

NORTH TORONTO, Aug. 9.—(Special.)—Chairman Burnaby's persistent efforts to tide over the placing in this year's estimates of certain expenses properly chargeable to next year, did not meet with the success to-night's meeting which it deserved.

With the illness of Chairman Parke of the finance committee, Councillor Burnaby has been discharging the duties pertaining to this position, and to-night's meeting in the town hall was called by him.

Mr. Burnaby frankly avowed the purpose of the meeting as being with a view to secure the co-operation of the public school board to a reconsideration of their estimates, but this was voted down by the mayor and Councillors Murphy, Councillor Irwin supporting.
