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FEBRUARY, the second month in the year. name is derived from februo, to purify or cleanse,—the feasts of the Lupercalia, or purification, being celebrated in this month. The Saxons called it Solnonath, because un's meridian altitude risibly increases in it. ebruary was not in the alendar of Romulus. It vas added to the year by Numa, who gave it the velfth place in the candar. The Decemviri ansferred it to the place which it now stands. uma assigned twentyght days to it, in order at the sum of the year ght be an uneven numr, according to a Pyagorean fancy. In an linary year, February s 28 days; in bissextile leap-year, it has 29th intercalary day.

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
