Who are the Koylies?

A passage in accounts of the fighting beyond Langemarck must, I fancy, have puzzled some readers of the papers, says a writer in the Westminster Gazette. It told of the holding of a position by "a mixed lot of Somerset, 'Koylies' and Rifle Brigade men." Who and what are the "Koylies?" was a question that I heard; one of the replies was that they were members of one of our native races. As a fact, the "Koylies" are the "King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry," with a record going back to Minster, and including everything big in the way of fighting up to the Boer war. The 1st Battalion of the "Koylies" was raised in 1753, and was "Yorkshire" from its birth, being intimately connected with the West Riding. Sir John Moore, although a Scotsman and a "Glesce keelie," served as an ensign in a field office with the "Koylies," who did glorious service with the regiment in the retreat to Corunna.
