Eighteen industrial groups reported increases over the previous week aggregating approximately 4,000 employes, while 12 reported aggregate reductions of 12,500. The movement of primary importance during the week was a contraction in the iron and steel group involving more than 11,000 workers, due mainly to temporary shutdowns in Ontario and Quebec railway shops. Other branches of this industry which suffered a decline were crude, rolled and forged products, agricultural implements machinery and other vehicles, and steel shipbuilding and repairing. On the other hand, there were minor increases in leading appliances plants. The only other decline of importance in industry occurred in logging in the Ontario-Que-
