Brantford police commissioners endorsed a proposal to have a provincial police benefit fund, and decided to increase the members of the local force to the following rates: First year, \$3.75; second, \$4; third, \$4.25; fourth, \$4.50; sergeants \$5. This is an increase from the following schedule: First year, \$3.20; second, \$3.35; third, \$3.45; fourth, \$3.60; sergeants, \$4.50.
