FISSET, JEAN BAPTISTE ROMUALD, M.D. (*Rimouski.*)

S. of Henri Fisset, J.P., of St. Cuthbert, P.Q. B. there 7 Feb. 1843. Ed. at Montreal Coll. ; graduated as M.D. at Laval Univ., 1867. M., Aimée, dau. of Honoré Plamondon, Esq., Quebec. Has been a Councillor and Mayor of the town of Rimouski. Is Surgeon of Provisional Batt., Rimouski Militia. An unsuccessful candidate for Rimouski in Quebec Assem., April 1872. First returned to Parl., for present seat at g.e., 1872 ; re-elected at g.e., 1874 and 1878 ; an unsuccessful candidate at g.e., 1882 ; re-elected at last g.e. Was the Liberal "whip" from 1878 to 1882. A Liberal.—*St. Germain de Rimouski.*

FISHER, SYDNEY ARTHUR, B.A., J.P. (*Brome.*)

S. of Dr. Arthur Fisher, of Montreal, whose grandf. came to Can. from Dunkeld, Scot. Born in Montreal 12 June, 1850. Ed. at the High Sch. and McGill Coll. there, and afterwards at Trinity Coll., Cambridge, Eng., where he graduated B.A. Unmarried. Is a farmer and J.P. for the District of Bedford, P.Q. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at election held Oct. 1880, after death of sitting mem. First returned to Parl. at g.e., 1882, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal, and favors a revenue tariff as opposed to a Protective Policy.—*Alva Farm, Knowlton, P.Q. ; Rideau Club.*
