

The Order of the Day being read for the third reading of the Bill intituled :
 "An Act further to amend the Post Office Act, 1875,"

The Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Botsford,

That the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that it be amended as follows:—

Page 2, line 1.—After "ral" insert "by registered letter addressed to him at Ottawa."

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and

Ordered, accordingly.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Botsford, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be now read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to make further provision respecting summary proceedings before Justices and other Magistrates," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Gowan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Flint, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House on Tuesday next.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the several Acts relating to the Board of Trade of the City of Toronto," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Allan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Lewin, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Banking and Commerce.
