The British North America Act.

- a foreign power, or does an act whereby he becomes a subject or citizen, or entitled to the rights or privileges of a subject or citizen, of a foreign power;
- (3.) If he is adjudged bankrupt or insolvent, or applies for the benefit of any law relating to insolvent debtors, or becomes a public defaulter;
- (4.) If he is attainted of treason or convicted of felony or of any infamous crime;
- (5.) If he ceases to be qualified in respect of property or of residence; provided, that a Senator shall not be deemed to have ceased to be qualified in respect of residence by reason only of his residing at the seat of the Government of Canada while holding an office under that Government requiring his presence there.
- 32. When a vacancy happens in the Senate by resigna-summons on tion, death or otherwise, the Governor General shall, by sum-Yacancy in mons to a fit and qualified person, fill the vacancy.
- 33. If any question arises respecting the qualification of a Questions as Senator or a vacancy in the Senate, the same shall be heard to Qualifications and determined by the Senate.

 Vacancies in Senate.
- 34. The Governor General may, from time to time, by Appointment instrument under the Great Seal of Canada, appoint a Senator of Speaker of to be Speaker of the Senate, and may remove him and appoint Senate. another in his stead.
- 35. Until the Parliament of Canada otherwise provides, Quorum of the presence of at least fifteen Senators, including the Senate. Speaker, shall be necessary to constitute a meeting of the Senate for the exercise of its powers.
- **36.** Questions arising in the Senate shall be decided by a voting in majority of voices, and the Speaker shall, in all cases, have a Senate vote; and when the voices are equal the decision shall be deemed to be in the negative.

The House of Commons.

37. The House of Commons shall, subject to the provisions Constitution of this Act, consist of one hundred and eighty-one Members, of House of of whom eighty-two shall be elected for Ontario, sixty-five Canada. for Quebec, nineteen for Nova Scotia, and fifteen for New Brunswick.
