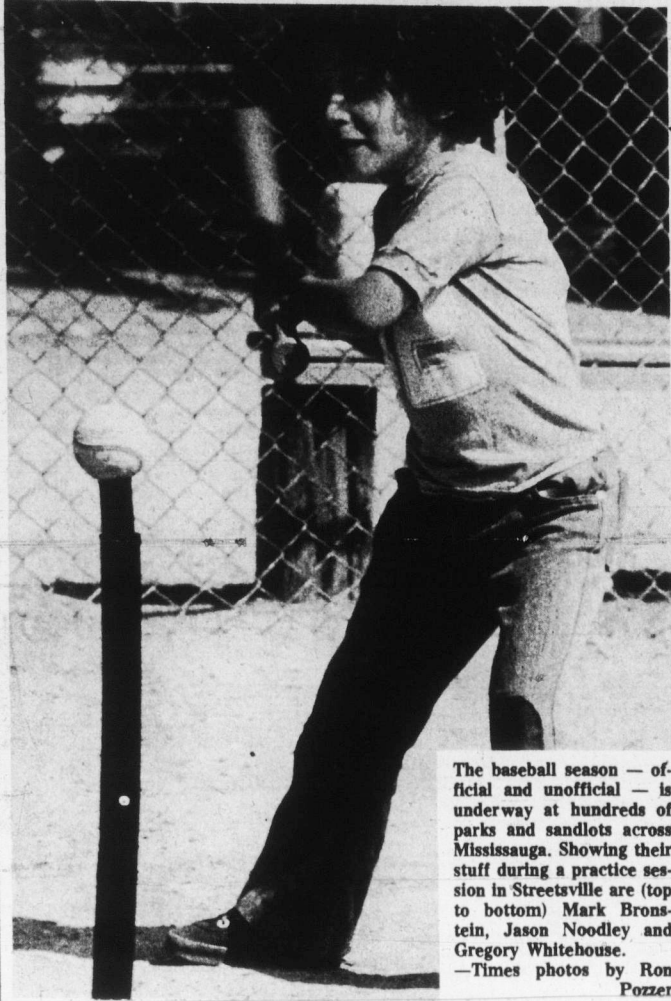
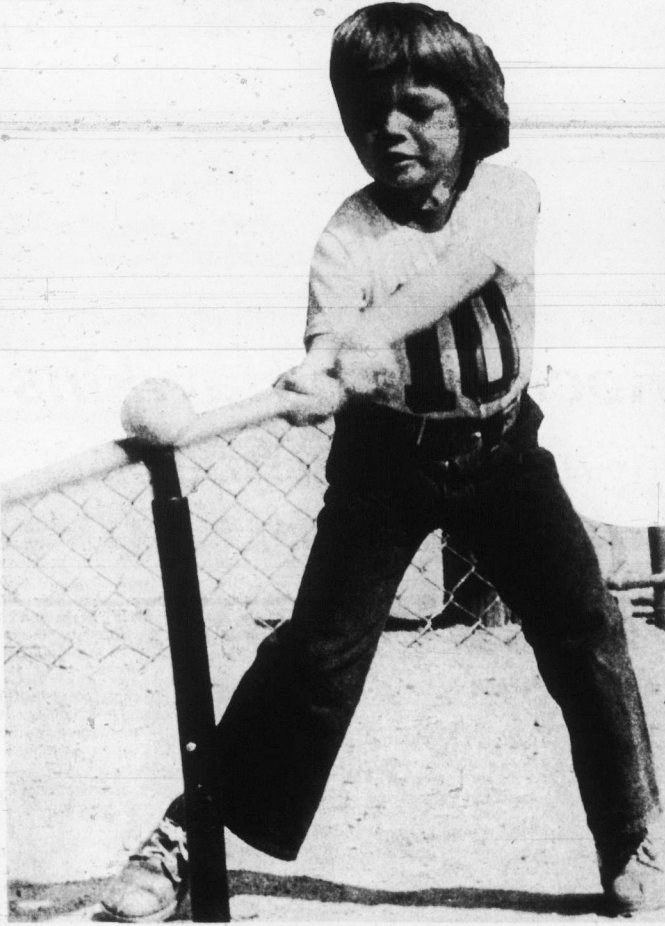

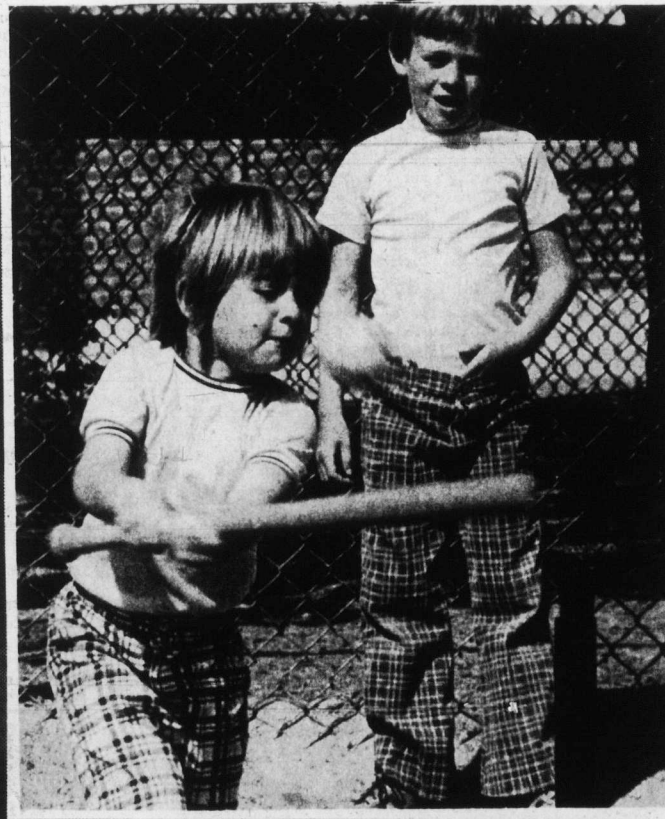

Man arrested in connection with kidnapping

A Toronto man has been arrested by Peel police in connection with the abduction of a teenager. Wayne Trevor Liberty, 30, of 3251 Martin Pines Dr. was reporting at the front counter of the Mississauga police station as a condition of his release from custody on another charge.

He was arrested there by Peel regional detective Denis O'Neill of the morality squad. Liberty was wanted by the Metropolitan Toronto police intelligence bureau on an arrest warrant issued after Joseph Boman, 19, was kidnapped at gunpoint by three men outside the William Bolton arena in

Toronto's west end on Feb. 2. Boman was pistol-whipped, blindfolded and taken to a cabin north of Parry Sound where he was held for 26 hours. Police said one of the kidnapers mentioned a \$10,000 ransom to Boman, but no demand for ransom was received.

Boman was released on case of mistaken identity. Bay is also charged with the kidnapping and police are looking for a third suspect in the case. Albert Wickie, 24, of North
