

Cape Mudge 17th July 9

Sir

I have the honor to acknowledge your letter of 20th June, requesting information concerning the fishway Mr Inspector McNab promised should be erected in the stream running from the lake into Village Bay.

I was unable to visit the locality during the month of June, but on Saturday last the 15th Inst. I proceeded there, and hearing that the foreman of the logging camp had been engaged in building the fishway, I at once asked him to come down, which he did. On arriving at the dam, he showed me the plan of the fishway, as he had left some of the covering unnailed till I could see it. As far as my knowledge of such matters goes, I should consider the fishway to be amply large for the purpose, and that the fish can now have easy access to the lake; it has also been well and substantially built. The inlet to the lake seems to me to be rather small, being 12ⁱⁿ x 16ⁱⁿ, but can easily be enlarged. Mr Inspector McNab has not yet inspected it, so the foreman informed me.
