III. MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

1. LITERATURE

There will be, as usual, a full line of literature at the Bookstore in the Auditorium. In addition, special exhibits of books have been arranged.

2. RECREATION

- (a) Baseball. There will be a series of baseball games to decide the championship of the conference. In this it is expected that all the delegations will participate. Arrangements have been made for the use of diamonds for teams of delegates not in the regular series and every afternoon there will be several games.
- (b) Tennis. The Northfield Seminary tennis courts are available for the use of the conference. There will be a tournament in doubles and singles.
- (c) Swimming. There will be a life-guard on duty at the Connecticut every afternoon. Delegates are earnestly requested to swim only during the afternoon and in the guarded section of the river. In previous years serious and sad consequences have followed the neglect of this rule.
- (d) Hikes. The country around Northfield well repays exploration, and many delegates will be glad to join the organized "tramps" that are taken from time to time.
- (e) Celebration. The annual celebration will be held as usual. In the afternoon there will be a track meet. In the evening the unique intercollegiate event for which Northfield is so justly famous is held in the Auditorium, followed by the great bonfire.

The afternoons are reserved for recreation. The main purpose of the conference will be greatly hindered if all recreation is not confined to the regular hours. All are asked to refrain from any play during the time of conference sessions.
