MEMO FOR HON. H. H. STEVENS

Referring to the attached memo of the 19th, I think Mr. Calder ought to be entrusted with the work in connection with any prosecution in the Montreal District and even beyond this district for the Canadian Customs. May I say to you, however, that Mr. Calder contemplates being a candidate though this is not decided. Mr. Patenaude understands the situation.

I think it very important that you take immediate steps to carry out the directions of Parliament regarding customs and specially in relation to dismissal. I hope you get this on trans before you leave.

I thought a hundred dollars a day for each counsel be sufficient and that both O'Connor and Calder should be employed. I saw Mr. Calder and he agreed to that - that is if he is not running as a candidate.
