Henzie, orderly rergesnt, to proceed to a vicinity in CMTORASSO where, Sgt. Henzie said, we would pick up two A.W.L. D.58101 Pte. Deslauriers, R., whom I now recognize was one of the two A.W.L. On the journey back to our detachment the two prisoners did not give us any trouble at all."
