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Mr. MELLISH intimated that he is at present engaged in collecting for the Society for colportage, and also soliciting donations to enable the Society to secure a building. He had already met with encouragement. Such a building would be a boon to the Society and an honor to the city.

Mr. Hugh J. Furneaux, who had spent some six or seven seasons in Newfoundland as a colporteur, spoke of his work in St. Pierre among the French, and among the fishermen in numerous harbors of Newfoundland. He had ever met with the greatest kindness from all classes, creeds and races.

The meeting was closed with the Benediction by Rev. Mr. Brown.
