At the begin-ning of every autumn great flocks of pigeons migrate from Siberia to Africa and pass over Cava and the Gulf of Salerno. They probably have other routes, but Cava is the only place where they are waylaid with nets and slings. The season is at its height from 15th to the 25th of October. From The pigeon-catchers are mostly men

of the lower middle class, who-club together to form six societies, or "games." A game usually consists of games." three or four towers and a clearing where the nets are set up. One tower is probably a thousand yards from the net, and the nearest perhaps seventy yards, but the distances vary. towers are tall and slim, windowless and weather beaten. There are steps about halfway up the inside, and a rickety ladder leads to the parapet at he top. Each society has also a neat ittle clubhouse, usually near the chief ower. 
