The mangled body was taken off the still revolving saw as life left it, a sight which in its sickening ghastliness it would be impossible to exaggerate. Dr. Karle was summoned, but no earthly power could give other advice than to direct the gathering up of the scattered fragments which had followed the course of the sawdust which runs down to the flat below, and thrown about in all directions.
