Enrollment has Begun for the

Will be Composed of Three Squadrons of Mounted Infantry and

Contingent.

Three Batteries. Ottawa, Dec. 22.—Militia orders have been issued for the organization of three squadrons of mounted rifles, A, B and C and three batteries of artillery, C, D and E. The squadrons will comprise 531 officers and men, and 536 horses. Ontario and the eastern provinces will furnish A squadron and Manitoba and the west B and C squadrons. Each squadron will consist of four troops. Troop three of A squadron is to be enrolled at London, Montreal and Kingston, and concentrated at Montreal.

Men will be enrolled from the active corps in each district, subject to a medical examination. To fill up, others who can ride and shoot will be accepted. The latter will have to provide their own horses, which the Government will pay for.

Of the three batteries, C will be mobilized at Kingston, D at Ottawa, and E at Quebec. The enrollment for D battery will be at Guelph, Ottawa, London and Port Hope: concentration at Ottawa, Dec. 22.-Militia orders have

E at Quebec. The enrollment for D battery will be at Guelph, Ottawa, London and Port Hope; concentration at Ottawa. Eligible candidates must have performed one annual artillery drill at least. For both artillery and tavalry the age limit is between 22 and 40. The total strength of the artillery will be 537 with 427 horses.
