The Opium Habit.

A Prohibitory Law was enacted against the sale, manufacture or importation of opium for smoking, passed July 20th, '08. Hardly a month after, the pamphlet was issued by the deputy minister telling of the use of the drug and consequent demoralization.

This law was to come into full effect six months later. It was reported that the Chinese were going to petition for a longer period in order to get rid of their stuff.

There were a number of factories owned and operated by the Chinese in Vancouver and Victoria. These have been closed up tight by the operation of the act.

The Chinese are a drawback to the coast. Dirty and immoral they crowd into houses by the score. Half that number would be too many.
