

The Garden Party



FROCKS for summer afternoon parties must be light and delightfully cool, therefore we combine plenty of lace and tulle with our soft summer materials or with taffeta. The models shown on this page have all been designed with this thought in mind. At the left is a smart little dress of white net with two deep flounces of palest yellow taffeta and a loose wide girdle of yellow chiffon. The materials and the color scheme are so delightful that there is need of nothing save a bit of real lace at the neck for trimming. The white straw hat faced with yellow is trimmed with clusters of white satin roses with black velvet leaves.

TWICE girdled with green moire ribbon and daintily flowered in green and blue the dress in the second illustration is a charmingly girlish affair. The blouse is long and is finished with scallops bound in green moire and edged with lace. The two rows of ribbon confine the fullness of the waist only to let it flare the more below. Two rows of ribbon also trim the low lace ruffled sleeves and a little lace and ribbon finish the yoke. A large hat of white chiffon is trimmed with green moire ribbon.

At the right is a frock of blue tulle with bodice of white tulle and sleeves and flounces of creamy lace. A band of blue outlines the yoke and a sash of black moire fastens with a long flowing end and a chiffon rose. A hat of black straw with a facing of blue and white striped silk has one large flat flower in white.

IN the background a glimpse is caught of a frock of pale blue Georgette crepe with a pointed basque effect in front and trimmed on each side at the waist line with a cluster of roses. An added touch of daintiness is given by the use of white chiffon at neck and sleeves. The hat is of blue tulle wreathed with white flowers which are fastened in the back with a bow of black and white striped ribbon.
